Deborah Hohman, a teacher at Eisenhower Elementary, passed away in 2009 after battling cancer. Many friends and family members contributed to this fund in her memory.

For all Kosciusko County Community Foundation Scholarships ONLY .

- Submit an application for each scholarship applied for with all the required attachments. Staple all attachments to each application, no paper clips. Do not attach information sheets to applications. Submit all applications at the same time, do not mail individually, bundle all applications in the order listed in the index.

In **ONE ENVELOPE SUBMIT** THE FOLLOWING **TWO** ITEMS, regardless of the number of submitted applications. Do not attach the envelope to any one application. Please write the student's name on the envelope. Failure to submit both items in an envelope with the student's name will result in an incomplete application:

- **ONE PHOTO** . A newsprint quality photo (no larger than 3x5), with the student's name on the back of the photo.
- **ONE FAFSA'S STUDENT AID REPORT (SAR)**, (the report FAFSA returns to you), including your name and the EFC (Expected Family Contribution) number. If ineligible to apply for FAFSA, obtain a Financial Aid Questionnaire from the Community Foundation.

Note: The IRS Form 1040 will not be accepted in place of the SAR.

Deadline for Submitting **April 1**

Required Attachments to the Standard Application Form Submit a copy of high school transcript including SAT/ACT scores or a copy of college transcript.

Two current letters of recommendation, one being from an educator and one being from an employer.

Qualifications

- Must have graduated from or attended for at least two years either Warsaw Community High School or Tippecanoe Valley High School.
- Must be pursuing a career or training associated with small animals, including by example veterinary medicine, veterinary technology and small animal grooming.
- Assistance may be provided for tuition, books and the purchase of reasonably necessary laboratory fees and supplies and/or tools to enable to obtain the recipient to acquire a job associated with small animals.
- Must demonstrate financial need.
- Must demonstrate work ethic and ability to pursue the course of study or job selected.
