This fund was created with gifts from Paramount Vantage and Warsaw Community High School in celebration of the movie American Teen, which debuted in theaters in 2008 and featured the lives of Warsaw Community High School students during their senior year.

Applicants must meet the following criteria to be matched to this fund:

- Graduate of Warsaw Community High School
- Studying Performing Arts
- Demonstrate financial need

Reviewers will consider the following additional criteria:

- Participation in performing arts during high school

Cecil Armstrong Educational Endowment (included in General Scholarship Fund)

Mr. Armstrong initiated this scholarship to assist those who were in financial need and had a desire to attend vocational or skilled trades education. Second preference goes to other applicants on the basis of need and personal situation.
