- Currently employed

Reviewers will consider the following when selecting a recipient:

- Participation in community service through church, service organization or youth group activities for at least two hours per week
- Willingness to contribute to education through employment

Preference may be given to:

- No preferences

Required recommendations:

Applicants must submit at least two recommendations for all scholarship opportunities.

Applicants must provide a handwritten essay addressing how they have overcome a personal obstacle.

Scott “Bibs” Bibler Memorial Scholarship Fund

Lisa Anne (Boggs) Fawley Memorial Scholarship Fund

Established by the parents of Lisa Anne (Boggs) Fawley, Robert and Marita Boggs, to award scholarships to graduates of Tippecanoe Valley High School (TVHS). Lisa was a 1975 graduate of TVHS, Grace College and Manchester University. She taught physical education in the Manchester and Tippecanoe Valley school systems.
